

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with **phonograms**. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word				
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word				
Phonograms	A phonogram is a series of letters that represents 1 or more sounds. The vowel sound changes in a phonogram.				

Here are some examples of words with phonograms:
