Grade 2: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 14

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with the <u>vowel team</u> <u>oo</u>. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word	
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word	
A vowel team has 2 or more letters side by side that ar pronounced as 1 vowel sound. Some vowel teams spel with 2 letters side by side can be pronounced 2 different ways.		

Here are some examples of words with the 2 pronunciations for the vowel team oo:

OO (long u as in moon)		00 (/oo/ as in book)	
boom	food	Brook	look
booth	hoop	good	nook
cool	mood	hood	wood
coop	zoom	hook	woof
