## Grade 2: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 17

In our classroom this week, we are reviewing how to read and spell words with **unpredictable vowel teams**. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
Vowel Teams	A vowel team has 2 or more letters side by side that are pronounced as 1 vowel sound. Some vowel teams spelled with 2 letters side by side can be pronounced 2 different ways.

Here are some examples of words with unpredictable vowel teams:

<b>ie</b> (chief/tie)	OO (moon/book)	<b>OU</b> (house/touch)	<b>ea</b> (eagle/bread)	<b>ew</b> (mew/screw)	<b>OW</b> (snow/owl)
