Grade 2: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 18

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with <u>vowel-r</u>. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word	
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word	
Vowel-r	The vowel-r pattern has 1 vowel followed by the consonant <i>r</i> , which affects the way the vowel sound is pronounced.	

Here are some examples of words with vowel-r:

ar	or	w+ar (pronounced /wor/)	w+or (pronounced /wer/)
art	corn	swarm	work
bark	for	war	worm
barn	fort	ward	worst
Bart	forth	warm	worth
chart	morning	warn	worthy
