## Grade 2: Weekly Phonics Focus

### Lesson 18

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with vowel-r. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

<b>Consonants</b>	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
<b>Vowels</b>	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
<b>Vowel-r</b>	The vowel-r pattern has 1 vowel followed by the consonant <i>r</i> , which affects the way the vowel sound is pronounced.

Here are some examples of words with vowel-r:

<b>ar</b>	<b>or</b>	<b>w+ar</b> <i>(pronounced /wor/)</i>	<b>w+or</b> <i>(pronounced /wer/)</i>
art	corn	swarm	work
bark	for	war	worm
barn	fort	ward	worst
Bart	forth	warm	worth
chart	morning	warn	worthy

<b>ar</b>	<b>or</b>	<b>w+ar</b> <i>(pronounced /wor/)</i>	<b>w+or</b> <i>(pronounced /wer/)</i>
